



1. INTRODUCTION

Molescroft Primary School is committed to supporting Fair-Trade wherever possible and seeks to maintain Fair-Trade Status. This is achieved through the following:

2. PLANNING FOR DEVELOPMENT

- Fair-Trade is part of the Molescroft Eco Schools Development Plan and therefore feeds into the School Improvement Plan.

3. USE OF FAIR TRADE PRODUCTS

- The Staff have agreed to purchase only Fair-Trade tea, coffee and hot chocolate for refreshments provided to guests and used by staff through the in-house refreshments scheme.
- When cooking in Design and Technology we agree to use wherever possible Fair-Trade ingredients.
- The Friends of Molescroft Primary School have agreed to only sell/supply tea, coffee and hot chocolate which are Fair-Trade at all their events.
- We seek to influence the LA to include the use of Fair-Trade products. We also seek to influence our fresh fruit supplier to source Fair-Trade fruit.
- We are encouraging our school uniform supplier to make items from Fair-Trade cotton

4. CURRICULUM

- Fair-Trade is taught as part of appropriate subjects. There is a minimum of one unit of work per year in addition to discussions in the Really Wild Club sessions.
- In addition, a Fair-Trade Homework is set to mark Fair Trade fortnight.

5. PROMOTING FAIR TRADE IN THE COMMUNITY

- We promote Fair Trade within the school community.
 - This includes special assemblies every year.
 - The school Green Team sells Fair Trade products through a shop "Crofty's Fair-trading Post" open every Friday at 10:15am.

- The local Fair-Trade representative is invited to set up a Fair-Trade stall at after school events, when parents are in the school.
- Fair trade hot chocolate is on sale every Friday morning break and is extremely popular.
- We encourage families to be aware of the Fair-Trade logo and encourage the purchase of Fair-Trade products with a logo collection sheet. Fair trade logos are collected and attached to the sheet. Once full with 28 logos collected from products bought by the family, the card can be exchanged for a 20% discount off any Fair Trade product in our shop.

Dear Parents, Carers, Governors, Friends, Staff and Pupils

Every year we engage in Fairtrade Fortnight to raise awareness of the initiative which seeks to ensure that farmers and other producers get a fair price for the goods produced. A fair price means that producers can provide a home and food for their families.

Every Friday in the winter we sell fairtrade chocolate and every week we have our fairtrade shop selling a range of products from around the world.

This year, Fairtrade Fortnight starts in half term, so I have a double challenge for the pupils.

To the right is the fairtrade logo. If you are going to the supermarket I would like to invite the children to look out for any products which have the logo.

Children from Y2 to Y6 are then asked to look where the product comes from. Please collect the names of countries on the back of this sheet. We will be collating the information for our Fairtrade launch assembly on the first day back after the holiday, Families with younger children do not need to record anything, but a discussion about the products would be most useful.

IN ADDITION, like last year, every child is to receive a savings card. All they have to do is cut out fairtrade logos from any products at home. It may be off a KitKat wrapper, a sticker off a banana or anything which has been genuinely bought with the fairtrade logo on it.

The savings card will remain "open".

When it is full the child

can exchange it at our fairtrade shop for a **20% discount off any of our fairtrade products.**

1 card per shop! A new card will also be given to the shopper.
