Children in Years 4,5 and 6 are invited to be a part of this year's Theatre Club production of Lionel Bart's 'Oliver!'

Set in Victorian England, the show tells the story of an orphan boy who is thrown out of the workhouse for uttering the line, "Please sir, I want some more". After being sold to equally heartless undertakers, he runs away to London to seek his fortune. In London, Oliver meets an outgoing boy known as the Artful Dodger who invites him to join him and his friends who live under the "care" of Fagin - a charismatically villainous wheeler-dealer who sends his gang of young pickpockets out to thief for him.

Nancy, the tough but kindly love interest of the fearsome Bill Sikes, takes a shine to Oliver. On his first pickpocketing mission, Oliver is arrested

but the compassionate Mr Brownlow sees that he was not at fault and takes him in.

Fagin and Sikes are determined to get Oliver back so that he doesn't report them to the authorities. Through a series of revelations, it becomes clear that Oliver is in fact Mr Brownlow's long-lost grandson.

Nancy is murdered by Sikes helping Oliver to escape. Eventually Sikes is shot, Dodger arrested, and Oliver is reunited with Mr Brownlow. Fagin is left alone.

The show is set to be fast paced, and a great mix of music, dance and performance.

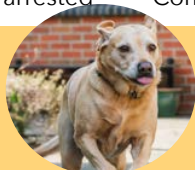

Theatre Club 2026 Y4-Y6

Monday Night is Theatre Club Night!

Continuing the high of our 2025 Buggy Malone performance, I am delighted to announce the show for 2026 - Oliver!

There are fantastic opportunities for singing, dancing and acting for all our Year 4 to Year 6 pupils. As always, we invite all children to be a part of the show in years 4-6. Rehearsals for Theatre Club will be held largely on Monday evenings after school from 3:30pm though there may be some on other evenings for soloists.

The first meeting for everyone interested will be on Monday 2nd March 2026 from 2:45pm. At this meeting the story will be explained, and numbers looked at so that chorus groups can be arranged. Most importantly arrangements will be made to support those in Year 5 and Year 6 who wish to take on a solo role. There are some absolutely wonderful character parts for boys and girls in equal measure. Some soloists will also have to be able to sing, act and dance extremely well as there are challenging roles. There will be a lot of involvement for the chorus members with some fantastic dance routines. A part will be found for all those wishing to be on stage.

Whereas I realise that performing on stage is not everyone's "cup of tea", I do hope the children will once

again want to be part of a great Molescroft tradition.

Monday 16th March 2026 will be the main audition session from 3:30pm to 6:00pm for Year 5 and 6 only. This will be to audition singing talent and the ability to tell a story through song.

Children will audition by singing at least part of a song of their choice, lasting around 1 minute long. This may be with a backing track or unaccompanied. During the week of the 16th, the children wishing to be selected for a solo part will also be called to read part of a story of their choice with dramatic effect.

This can be prepared in advance, with the children bringing their text with them. There may be recalls. In addition children will learn a dance to demonstrate their ability to pick up dance moves quickly. Final decisions will not be announced until after a public performance in assembly on Friday 20th March 2026.

Eventually there will be a rehearsal schedule meaning that children will not have to attend every Monday evening or indeed for the full Monday evening rehearsal. It will be important though that every child involved does attend when required and that once a commitment is made it is expected that everyone will see the project through to the end.

Children will be able to make a decision on whether they wish to remain with the production up to Friday 27th March 2026 when final lists will be published. Pupils however MUST be available for each night. This is a commitment to the team effort, the show, friends and the school.

Parents will be asked to sign to indicate that they are keeping the three performance nights and dress rehearsal free.

Children may bring a snack to the club to be eaten at a scheduled break time.

The first rehearsal will be on Monday 20th April though the soloists may rehearse before this date. As always the rehearsal period is going to be extremely tight!

Costumes will either be provided by home, or where necessary we shall source and buy costumes as required.

Parents will be asked to pay for these costumes up to a maximum of £15.

Further details will be sent home with the children who express interest in participating in this year's production.

Uniform Reminders

Shoes - suitable for Primary School life

Since the end of the Autumn term we have noticed a rise in children opting for footwear that is not suitable for school wear. We do not have a 'formal' school shoe policy unlike other nearby schools, rather choosing an approach that allows children to select what is both comfortable and suitable for a day in school. Shoes such as the popular UGG 'slipper', UGG Boots, or shoes with a raised heel are not appropriate, causing trips and falls due to reduced foot support.

Please ensure that children's school footwear is good fitting, breathable and suitable for a day in a primary school. A further reminder that children require a change of footwear for outdoor P.E. Thank you in advance.

E-Scooters

Humberside Police Advice

All Beverley schools work closely with their link PCSO within Humberside Police and collaborate to ensure the safety of those travelling to and from our school sites. There has been a noted increase in children and/or parents using E-scooters to and from schools. 'It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance.'

A new skill for our Moles!

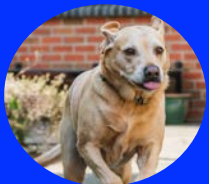

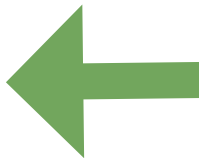
